Event to commemorate Frederick Douglass' 200th birthday

Emory Libraries will co-host "Frederick Douglass: A Bicentennial Tribute" on Tuesday, Nov. 27, from 6-9 p.m., to celebrate the abolitionist's 200th birthday.

Co-hosted with the Consulate General of Ireland and open to the public at no charge, the event will feature live readings from his speeches, editorials, and letters. Presenters will include Oscar-winning actor Louis Gossett Jr., Emory faculty and staff, Atlanta community members, and one of Douglass' direct descendants.

Conservator to discuss Dante's 1466 book project


